# **CSB Hosts the IMAGINE** Leadership Conference

We hosted 13 accounting students from across the southeast at our second IMAGINE Leadership Conference on May 18 and 19. Through games, activities, thought-provoking questions, and dynamic speakers, we challenged the students to explore three traits that are essential for successful leadership:

- Defining personal *values*

in all aspects of their lives.

Creating a *vision* for the future, and Gaining the confidence to use their *voices* 



The first day of the conference was at the beautiful Balcony on Church Street in Fairhope. Managing partner Kenny Crow kicked it off by talking with the students about how he has grown through personal experiences. Between starting his own firm as a young accountant to his wife being diagnosed with breast cancer in her 50s, he learned that in life he is the "passenger" and God is driving. Pointing to two of his recent readings, The Go-Giver and The Fred Factor, Kenny said these books really bring home the importance of focusing on the needs of others.

Our first guest speaker, Scott Tindle, spoke about values. Scott is known for bringing the Duck Boats to Mobile, and turning Fort Conde into "A hybrid between Colonial Williamsburg and Epcot." Regarding values, Scott said that you should "Treat others the way they want to be treated," without bringing yourself into it.

As a business owner, Scott emphasized the importance of employees coming first and treating them like people instead of assets of the company. If the employees are satisfied, then the customers will naturally be treated well and the bottom line will increase as a result. His contribution to the growth of Mobile is part of achieving his goal of helping build a city where his children will want to raise their families.

The second day of the conference was held at Five Rivers-Alabama's

Delta Resource Center. Jonathan McConnell spoke on vision. Jonathan served our country as a Marine and is the founder of Meridian Global Consulting LLC, a global maritime security agency. Meridian was formed while he was still in law school and learned of the hijacking of the Maersk Alabama by Somali pirates. Jonathan makes it a point to hire Marine veterans to staff his company.

According to Jonathan, disconnecting is very important in establishing your vision. Whether you pray or meditate, or just take time to think alone for a certain amount of time every day, disconnecting and clearing your mind helps you stay on course. It is not necessary to constantly be available through your phone and social media. He also emphasized the importance of overcoming fear and acting on your ideas and visions.

Judge Edmond Naman closed the conference and spoke about voice. As a former lawyer and District Attorney, he has had quite a bit of experience with crime. It all started when he was a young boy and lost his admired uncle in a violent robbery. This life-changing event inspired him to be a lawyer. As he dealt with crime and saw what was happening to young people in the most impoverished communities, he figured out how he wanted to use his voice, becoming a juvenile court judge and advocating for troubled youth.

After many people in the community began to hear his frustrated and alarmed voice for these children, good things started happening. Under Judge Naman's leadership, a program called NEST was founded (Nurture Empower Strengthen Transform). They use teams of 5 or 6 people, and each team sponsors an at-risk youth. The team members serve as mentors and do everything from providing financial support to transporting young people to and from activities. Judge Naman claims that it was a supernatural force that gave him his voice. He challenged the students to decide what voice inside them must be heard.

Our hope is that as a result of the conference, the students will be on the road to identifying their core values, have a vision in mind for what they want their futures to look like, and be comfortable using their voices in everything they do. Through these hard-hitting and inspirational stories, self-exploration, and spending time with our team members, we invite them to imagine what a difference they can make in their families, schools, local communities and the world. #


